

(Based on the O Antiphons)

After praying the Antiphon for each day, pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be.

December 16

Pastor qui regis Israel, intende; qui deducis velut ovem Joseph: veni ad ducendum et confortandum nos.

Shepherd, You Who rule over Israel, hear us; You Who lead Joseph like a sheep: come to guide and comfort us.

December 17

Sapientia, quae ex ore Altissimi prodiisti, attingens a fine usque ad finem, fortiter suaviterque disponens omnia: veni ad docendum nos viam prudentiae.

Wisdom, Which proceeds from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from end to end and ordering all things mightily and sweetly: come to teach us the way of prudence.

December 18

Adonai, et dux domus Israel, qui Moysi in igne flammae rubi apparuisti, et ei in Sina legem dedisti: veni ad redimendum nos in brachio extento.

Sacred Lord, and Leader of the House of Israel, Who appeared to Moses in the flame of the burning bush, and gave him the Law on Mount Sinai: come to redeem us with Your outstretched arm.

King of the Gentiles, and their desire, the cornerstone that makes both one: come and save man whom You have formed from the dust.

December 23

Emmanuel, Rex et legifer noster, exspectatio Gentium, et Salvator earum: veni ad salvandum nos, Domine Deus noster. Emmanuel, our King and Lawgiver, desire of the Gentiles, and their Savior: come and save us, O Lord our God.

December 24

qui sedes super cherubim, Domine Deus virtutum: veni, ostende faciem tuam, et salvi erimus.

You Who are seated upon the cherubim, Lord God of Hosts: come, show Your face, and we shall be saved.

Christmas Schedule and Novena

This week we enter into the final days of Advent. The Christmas Novena begins on **December 16** and is the oldest recorded novena in the Church. It commemorates the nine months that Jesus spent in the womb of Mary. See this week's bulletin insert for a simple novena using the beautiful O Antiphons, the basis for the familiar hymn, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel. The schedule of Masses for Christmas can also be found on the insert, as well as in the vestibules of the church. "Come Lord Jesus, and do not delay!"
