Dear Saint Rita Parishioners,

Happy New Year from Saint Rita School! This year marks our 73rd anniversary of service to the members of our parish and local community. Our school was the recipient of two prestigious awards this year: *Cardinal Newman Guide* and *Purple Star School*. Since its inception, Saint Rita School has endeavored to bring truth, goodness, and beauty to the children of our parish. With over 260 students currently enrolled in our preschool and K-8th grade programs, we are excited to live out our mission. Our students and staff recently memorized our Mission Statement, which reflects the heart of our work:

Saint Rita School believes that "the soul of education is the education of the soul" (Pope Pius XI). We are a small Catholic school in the classical tradition, dedicated to forming children intellectually and spiritually following the teachings and traditions of the Catholic Church. We treasure faith in Jesus Christ and are dedicated to serving His people.

The education of our children is a sacred task, one we undertake in union with our parents, pastor, and you, our parishioners. One of the greatest challenges we face is keeping Catholic education affordable. As Pastor and Principal, we work together with the Diocese to help support families who would otherwise be unable to afford Catholic education for their children. This year, one third of our students are receiving over \$225,000 in financial assistance. These funds come from Saint Rita Parish, the Diocese of Arlington, PTO fundraising, and through private donors. We are so grateful for the support of our parish! As we offer our thanks, we pray that you will continue to provide both spiritual and financial support for our families. A recent financial aid recipient commented:

My family has been part of Santa Rita Church for 9 years, and with the church and school's financial and tutoring support, all of my children will graduate from this school. As a family, we are grateful for all the support provided to us over the years. Without this support, my children would not have had a quality Catholic education! Blessings to all the people who make it possible for our children to have the opportunity to receive an education based on the principles of the Catholic Church.
